RULE IMPACT STATEMENT

A. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PURPOSE OF PROPOSED RULES:

This proposed rule change establishes the requirement of demonstrable experience in Pre-Kindergarten through 12th grade school operation and aligns the application process with the recently adopted charter school act.

B. CLASS OF PERSON(S) AFFECTED (CLASS BEARING COST OF RULES):

The proposed rule will assist prospective virtual school applicants in understanding the application requirements, the contract terms, and the school establishment requirements. Additionally, prospective and current school leaders will be made aware of the performance framework they will be held to, as well as the school documents they will be required to submit for oversight purposes.

The proposed rules will benefit prospective and current virtual charter school leaders as stated above.
