

**TITLE 777. STATEWIDE VIRTUAL CHARTER SCHOOL BOARD
CHAPTER 15. OKLAHOMA SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE COURSE CERTIFICATION**

Rule Impact Statement

A. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PURPOSE OF PROPOSED RULES:

The Statewide Virtual Charter School Board (SVCSB) makes publicly available a list of supplemental online courses which it has reviewed and certified to ensure that the courses are high quality options and are aligned with the subject matter standards approved by the State of Oklahoma. In conjunction with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES), the SVCSB negotiates with online course providers to offer a state rate price to school districts for supplemental online courses. These rules have been proposed for the purpose of implementing policy and procedures pursuant to Oklahoma Statute Title 70, Section 3-145.3.

B. CLASS OF PERSON(S) AFFECTED (CLASS BEARING COST OF RULES):

The proposed rules will affect K-12 online course providers seeking certification for inclusion in the Oklahoma Online Course Catalog and those who review online courses for quality and alignment to state content standards.

C. CLASS OF PERSON(S) BENEFITED BY PROPOSED RULES:

The proposed rules will benefit public school districts and the students they serve.

D. DESCRIPTION OF ECONOMIC IMPACT UPON AFFECTED CLASSES OF PERSONS OR POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS

The agency does not anticipate any economic impact upon affected classes of persons or political subdivisions as a result of implementation of the proposed rules at this time.
